- Safeguard campers' prescription medications and administer as arranged
- Record and maintain records of camper visits and inquiries in medical log

- Complete insurance forms and appropriate Incident Reports
- Provide training in preventative health care for staff and campers
- Maintain camp infirmary/health center
- Communicate to Camp Director areas for improvement or concerns
